Summer School Administrations of End-of-Grade and End-of-Course Assessments for 2014-15 Accountability

Districts and charter schools having a bona fide summer school program must complete summer school testing and upload all test data to the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction (NCDPI) no later than **June 30, 2015**; **by 5:00 p.m**. Scores from summer school administrations occurring later than June 30, 2015, will be used in 2015–16 accountability results. Results from end-of-course (EOC) English II administered during a summer program will be delayed and will be included in 2015–16 accountability. Summer school administration scores will be counted only for proficiency, not growth.
